1. **All exhibits must be entered by 8 am - 10 am on Wednesday, July 12th. Judging will begin at 10:30.**
2. Competition open to residents of Stafford and adjoining counties.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to 2 entries per class.
4. **There will be a professional division, adult division and youth division for all class numbers. Please mark (P) if you are a commercial grower or grow food products for resale, (A) for adult (19 and up), (T) for teens (13-18 yrs. of age), and (Y) for youth (5-12 yrs. of age) after each class number to specify age division.**
5. All entries in this department must be grown by the exhibitor in current year.
6. Information about exhibiting produce is available in the publication "*Exhibiting Fruits and Vegetables*" available at the Extension Office or online at www.ksre.edu/bookstore/pubs/c405.pdf
7. Where there is no competition, exhibits will be judged on individual merit and receive premium and ribbon accordingly.
8. All garden produce should be exhibited on a sturdy plate, bowl or container that will support the weight of the produce.
9. Exhibits and ribbons cannot be removed before 7:30 pm Saturday, July 15th.
10. All premiums will be \$3. \$2. \$1 in each class. Classes 83-105 will be one premium of \$5.
11. An Overall Grand Champion & Reserve Champion will be selected from all classes combined.

102. **Best Display Garden Produce** - a collection of at least 5 different fresh vegetables and/or fruits with not more than 2 varieties of any one kind. The number of specimens of the different vegetables and/or fruits exhibited are: large -1 each, medium - 5 each, small - 12 each
103. **Scarecrow** - Entry may be made as an individual or as a group project. All scarecrows measuring from floor to top must be under 6 feet, and must be secured to a 6-foot stake. Accessories, if used, must be firmly attached to scarecrow. Entries will be judged on eye appeal, construction, use of materials and durability.
104. **Old Fashioned Scarecrow** - a traditional farm or garden scarecrow used to scare birds away from crops
105. **Celebrity or Character Look-Alike Scarecrow** - one made to resemble a celebrity, such as entertainer, TV personality, sports figure, cartoon etc. **INCLUDE NAME OF CELEBRITY ON ENTRY.**
